FROM THE EARTH CARE TEAM **Celebrating an Earth-friendly Christmas**

Atlanta writer Celestine Sibley wrote a newspaper column decades ago titled "Christmas Catalogs Tempt the Thrifty," complaining about Sears Roebuck and Montgomery Ward. In the decades since then, we seldom hear the word *thrifty* associated with Christmas, while pounds of unsolicited catalogs pile up in our mailboxes. Sibley wrote that the adults in her family had decided to refuse gifts that were new and store-bought. Instead, she wrote, "We will exchange only: 1) things we have,

2) things we make, or

3) things we buy at yard sales.

No expenditure of cash, no use of the magic plastic card allowed."

Her ideas remind us that the insidious take-over of our most holy days by consumerism has been going on for a long time. Since this column was written, our culture's celebration of Christmas has exploded into practices that involve the waste of natural resources including trees and fossil fuels. Here is an opportunity for an annual family conversation in which we look closely at what celebrating in our homes costs the Earth. How many lights? How much packaging? What are the best ways to enjoy a feast, family, friends, and giving?

Of course, Black Mountain Presbyterian Church has been addressing these questions for many years, and both the Alternative Gifting and Presbyterian Giving catalogs are filled with opportunities for giving and enriching the lives of others.



Library News from Sally Woodard

Recently I have become interested in how many of the books in our BMPC section of the library are either memoirs or biographies of people who have associations with the Black Mountain Church. BMPC has been blessed over the years with numerous authors, many of whom have lived exciting lives. This month I want to highlight a few of these. Among them are quite a few who have been missionaries in places other than the U.S.

Kenneth Scott, Sr.'s Around the World in


Eighty Years recounts his time as a medical officer in the China-Burma-India Theater during WWII, as a teacher of medical skills in Korea, and as director of a Christian Medical College and Hospital in India. The book contains both accounts of exciting adventures and



personal details of his life and those of some of the well-known figures he encountered in a fruitful

life, which blessed so many.

Mariella Talmage Provost's *I Gave You to the Lord* is another inspiring account of someone who felt the call of God to minister in another country. As a descendant of missionaries – her great grandfather served



in China ,and she grew up in Korea as her father served there – she too was inspired to go to Korea. The title of her books reflects the reason. As she tells in the beginning, her mother said that when Mariella was born she gave her to the Lord. Much of her concern was with children, especially Korean orphans and, after her return to Black Mountain, students at the Ebenezer Institute.

A sidelight about these two books is the intersection of the lives of the Scott family and the Provost family. Ken Scott tells of how the bedrooms of the Provost and the Scott homes were often used as delivery rooms since both Mariella and his wife Ann were excellent nurses. He adds that his daughter Betsy was born in one of those bedrooms.

Another third generation missionary, whom most of us know, is still in service. Faith Bradley sings in the choir, plays handbells, and is active in

PW. Her memoir *With God's Song in My Heart* describes her childhood in China, including escaping from Japanese invasion, her young adult time in the U.S. as she prepared to go to the mission field, and her own service in Taiwan, where she met Blake Bradley.



Faith's description of mission among the Bunum people is graphic and poignant. This is another testimony to the incredible lives of service among the congregation of BMPC.

These books will be on display for checkout during the month of December, as will a few of the Christmas books in the library. Even during the busy season of Advent and Christmas, find some time for rest and enjoy a book from the library.
