# SOWING THE SEEDS HARVESTING THE FRUITS

In response to the glorious news of Easter, Black Mountain Presbyterian Church's session is excited to announce a final season to our capital campaign! Sowing the Seeds: Harvesting the Fruits is an investment in the future for our church and beyond. This is the bold vision that began at Black Mountain in August 2020 as we first began to raise funds for our capital projects – and continues today as we celebrate and harvest the fruits of all the glorious changes our renovations have brought us.

As we enjoy our mission and ministries in our updated church facilities, we believe this is the right time to complete the work started four years ago with *Sowing the Seeds: Planting our Future*. At that time, BMPC committed itself to raising most of the project's costs upfront through the *Sowing the Seeds* campaign – which was done through the extraordinary generosity of all of you.

With the physical space complete, it is time to

focus on securing our financial future. The goal of this final phase is \$550,000, which will retire the debt we incurred due to rising building costs, unforeseen change orders, and creating more accessible spaces in the sanctuary and bathrooms. Paying off the debt will enable us to grow and continue to thrive for the next forty years.

Harvesting The Fruits will pave the way for BMPC's vibrant future and empower the congregation to continue to be a thriving presence in our community for generations to come. On April 21, our co-chairs for Sowing the Seeds, Mary Carroll Dodd and Bill Waterstradt, will publicly kick off phase three in worship, and on May 5, we will dedicate our commitments at all three of our worship services.

How wonderful it will be to head into our summer season knowing that we, as a congregation, will have commitments in hand to pay off our debt by the end of 2025!

# Sunday Night Live Spring Bird Migration in Western North Carolina

On Sunday April 14, at 5:30 p.m., the Congregational Life Team is sponsoring a potluck dinner followed by a fascinating presentation by James Poling. The title of his program is "Spring Bird Migration in Western North Carolina." Dozens of tropical birds come through western North Carolina in the spring. Some nest in our mountains, and some continue their journey to the northern U.S. and Canada. April and May are peak times to observe the colorful plumages of the breeding cycle. Since retirement, in 2008, James has become a Blue Ridge Naturalist and is a member of the Blue Ridge Audubon Society, and the Western Carolina Botanical Club. He will share some of his bird photography of recent years.

James is a member of our church. He spent his career as a pastor, professor, scholar, and writer, most recently at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, Evanston, IL

This is a program that has been praised for its beauty and educational value. It is one that both children and adults will love.

# Springtime brings anticipation as the new growing season cranks

up! BMPC and First Baptist Church look forward to seeing how our joint garden patch will grow healthy vegetables for our neighbors who struggle to feed their families.

The garden began in 2004 in the backyard of one of the members of the Baptist Church, but in 2007, needing more space, members plowed up a space 90' x 90' on the church property, in the space where the playground for the Donald Collins early learning center is now located.

In 2012 the Earth Care Team from Black Mountain
Presbyterian Church began partnering with the Baptist
Church, and the project became the Black Mountain
Ecumenical Garden. In 2018 construction at the Learning
Center forced the garden to relocate, where it is now a
60' x 20' plot at the corner of Midland Avenue and First

Street. The mission of the garden is "to be good stewards of the land and to provide healthy fresh vegetables to our neighbors in the Swannanoa Valley with God's help." When vegetables are harvested they are usually distributed through Swannanoa Valley Christian Ministry and Bounty & Soul.

This year the garden needs more help as members of the gardening team have grown older and experienced health issues. People are needed to perform the different planting, weeding, and harvesting tasks. Gardening is a great activity for families to do together and a basic life skill for young people to learn alongside older adults. Typically, work days ("garden parties") are flexible and built around volunteer schedules, growing season, and the weather. A "garden party" might begin in the early morning or early evening to avoid the heat, and last less than an hour depending on volunteer availability. There are also ways volunteers could come on their own time to help with weeding, mulching, and harvesting. Volunteers are encouraged to bring their own garden tools, gloves, protection from the weather and water to drink. — Jeannie Franklin, Earth Care team
