## **Magnetic Lock for Narthex Door**

The Property Committee is having a magnetic lock and

keypad installed on one of the narthex doors. Following detailed discussions with staff, the committee reached a decision that we needed to improve building security during office hours. There have been several incidences in the past few months where unidentified persons have walked into the building and office area. On at least two occasions, the persons have been hostile towards staff. This lack of security can pose a risk for the children in the Weekday School. Given that there are many times during the day when there are only two to three staff members present, the committee determined that staff safety and member safety was not adequate. The magnetic lock and keypad will typically be utilized only during regular office hours (9-4p). Members and visitors can also gain access by ringing the doorbell. Staff or volunteers in the office area will be able to remotely unlock the door. After church business hours, the doors will be locked as normal and will require a key. Existing keys will continue to work as they do now. The Property Committee understands that this represents a "culture change" for our church as we pride ourselves on being welcoming. However, we also need to provide our staff, members, and guests with a safe and secure environment. 




The Center provides showers, mail receipt, phone service, and storage for homeless people in the community.

About 200 people visit A HOPE each day

and when someone in our community becomes homeless, it is often the first stop on the journey to permanent housing. Volunteers from the A Hope team greet visitors, hand out towels and soap, make coffee, work in the mail room and perform other clerical activities that give the professional staff time to work directly with their clients.

Even inclement weather doesn't stop them. On March 12, snow and all, John and Betsy Murphy managed to drive to Asheville to help the regular staff on a day when shelter and warmth were particularly needed.

Because of the generosity of BMPC and some other neighborhood donations, they were able to take a new

# **Volunteers Needed**Room In The Inn — April 30-May 7

Van drivers, meal providers, mattress movers, and overnight hosts are needed and no experience is required. All you need is an open heart and a little time. Before- and on-the-job training is provided!

#### What you need to know

Room in the Inn (RITI) houses up to 12 homeless women at a time, in a different host church or agency each week. The RITI program is coordinated by Homeward Bound in Asheville, which provides case management services to the women enrolled while they are waiting for and after they find permanent housing.

Homeward Bound is a "housing first" agency, believing that a homeless person's primary need is for permanent housing. Only with safe and dependable housing can homeless persons focus on their other issues. **Between 2009 and 2016, RITI hosted 289 individual women and found permanent housing for 107 of those.**The retention rate for those placed in permanent housing is an impressive 91.5%.

The women enrolled in RITI are at the host churches from dinner time each evening until breakfast the next morning, after which they go back to Homeward Bound's

A Hope Day Center in Asheville. During the days, the women may go to jobs or job interviews, support group meetings, medical appointments, and so forth.

BMPC has been a host church for RITI every year since 2003. We will be using the Black Mountain United Methodist Church House again this year.

#### What we do

Host churches provide the women a hot evening meal, breakfast, and a bag lunch to take with them into Asheville during the day. We also provide van transportation morning and night to and from A-Hope. Two volunteers are needed at the host church from 6 p.m. until 6:30 a.m. The overnight volunteers take turns staying awake, and there is a volunteer room with two single beds in it for the volunteer off duty to sleep in. RITI coordinators from both the church and Homeward Bound are available by phone at all times in case questions or emergencies arise. We will also need volunteers for moving lightweight mattresses from our church house to the Methodist Church House before our host week, taking the linens back to Mission Hospital on Monday, May 8, and delivering blankets and mattress pads to and from a local laundromat for wash/dry/fold service after our hosting week ends.




## **Not Getting Church Emails?**

Members of the team are Wayne Mullis, Gay Mothershed, Joseph Mathews, Beth Gunn, Karen Davis, Alison Banzhoff, and Skip Stansell. With the guidance of Mary Katherine, consultant, Art Ross, and a wonderful planning guide: Holy Conversations: Strategic Planning as a Spiritual Practice for Congregations, we are looking forward to our work together.
